#### F1 in Schools

A huge congratulations to our three Formula 1 in Schools teams, Bay Racing, Eyre Racing and Oceanic, who very successfully competed in the state championships at the Royal

Adelaide Show last week with two of our three teams winning the state finals in their division. Bay Racing, Junior Development class, won a host of awards throughout the competition and Eyre Racing defeated our Oceanic Team in the Junior Professional Class to also claim a state title, with both teams now eligible to in the Nationals early next year. Congratulations and thanks to Mr Redden and staff who have been involved in our F1 in Schools program this year, to our students who have learnt amazing amounts and worked tirelessly on improving their cars and teams, and to the community who has rallied around and supported this program and our students. #### **Student Free Day**

Last Friday's Student Free Day was focussed on working with improving our differentiation teaching skills which was led by staff from the Department's Inclusive Evidence and Advice Team. A considerable amount of time was spent exploring the link between engagement, learning and student behaviour, the importance of clear class learning intentions and role of quality curriculum and differentiation in an inclusive classroom. Staff feedback from the day was very positive and we are currently planning ongoing connection with this team.

The final student free day for this year is scheduled for Monday 13<sup>th</sup> of November, which is week 5 of term 4.

#### **Industrial Action**

As you may be aware, currently the Australian Education Union (AEU) and our State Government are working through the agreement for the Enterprise Bargaining Agreement. These discussions have made progression since the industrial action on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> of September, in which our school was open but offered a Modified Program. We are hoping that a position on the Enterprise Agreement will be reached amicably in the near future without the need for further industrial action from the AEU.

#### Men's Literacy Day

After an absence for the past couple of years due to COVID-19, our annual Men's Literacy Day was held on the morning of Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> of September. It was fantastic to see how well supported this event was by our fathers, step fathers, uncles, grand fathers and other significant males in our student's lives, it was one of the largest turnouts we've had and we thank everyone who came into the school to support this event. Men's Literacy Day was focussed on promoting the love of learning and literacy and the important part literacy plays in all our lives with everything we do. Many thanks to Mrs Hill and the Primary staff for all their work in making this day such a successful event.

#### **Around the School**

Primary Assemblies are continuing this term, many thanks to all the parents and family members who are coming along to support these events. The Year 11 Outdoor Education class is currently concluding their ride to Venus Bay National Park camp. On Tuesday they rode 63kms and stayed the night in Baird Bay then rode a further 44kms on Wednesday to the National Park and spent the night out spotting bilbies with the Rangers. They completed 16kms back towards school this morning before bad weather stopped further riding. Last week three students competed in SAPSASA golf in Adelaide in very trying conditions.



#### F1 IN SCHOOLS STATE FINAL COMPETITION

The F1 in Schools state final, held at the Royal Adelaide Show 2023, was a remarkable event for our school. A total of 15 students formed three teams to compete in both the development and professional classes, demonstrating a wide range of skills in this STEM-based program. These included teamwork, collaboration, design, engineering, CADD design, CAM manufacturing, verbal presentations, trade displays, marketing, and team branding.

Our development class team, Bay Racing, achieved an impressive feat by winning the Outstanding Industry Collaboration, Fastest Lap, Grand Prix Race, Knockout Champions, and Development Class Overall Champions award. This is our best performance since we started participating in the challenge in 2018. In the professional junior class, our teams, Eyre Racing and Oceanic, faced stiff competition, including this year's national development team from SA.

Despite the strong competition, our teams stood out with their professionalism, impressive uniforms, and exceptional trade displays. After delivering their verbal presentations, the teams returned with a positive outlook. In a close battle, Eyre Racing emerged as the winner of the junior professional class, defeating Oceanic. As a result, Eyre Racing will be advancing to the national final in 2024. This is the first time that two teams from Streaky Bay have qualified for the national finals, a remarkable achievement for the only rural school competing in the challenge in South Australia.

In addition to the competition, our students had the opportunity to engage in various activities and demonstrations that the show had to offer. Overall, their outstanding efforts are something they should all be proud of. The school and students wish to express our heartfelt gratitude to the local businesses and community members for their financial sponsorship, in-kind support, industry collaboration, and well wishes for our teams. It's truly remarkable how our small rural community rallies behind our teams, enabling them to compete at such a professional level. #### MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS

#### Year 7 HASS - New Town

Wow! It's unbelievable that we are already in week 8 of Term 3. In Year 7 HASS, we have been exploring the 'Water and our World' unit of work. We started the term by using our prior knowledge of water and water resources and realised that we needed to know a lot more about this important and precious resource.

We have almost finished our HASS assignment task which was to use their imagination in that they had survived a geographical event here at Streaky Bay. Only 20 people survived which included them and 19 others involving family and some community members.

All energy, communication and water systems had failed and life as we know it, had ended. They fled their local Streaky Bay area in the hope of building their new town of which they built the last 2 stages on Minecraft Education. Their town would need to be accessible and developed over time to maintain the wellbeing and growth of their community.

The whole class displayed a lot of interest in the initial escape plans (10weeks) and have shown great persistence and work ethic in their learning to complete the last two stages of the task.

The aim of the assignment was to offer students not only the opportunity to learn and build their knowledge of water and its resources, but also to work with others, use their research and literacy skills, whilst incorporating the Minecraft Education program.






























#### GUIDELINES FOR POKEMON TRAFDING CARDS AND SIMILAR TRADABLE ITEMS

In recent times, there has been a surge in the popularity of trading cards, notably Pokemon and Football Cards, among our students. It's heartening to witness our students engaging in such passionate hobbies that foster camaraderie and strategic thinking. These cards have not only become a source of entertainment but also a means of building valuable friendships. We are currently monitoring the handling of these cards when students are wanting to trade. Given the guidelines listed below we may consider reviewing the trading between students if they do not abide by our expectations.

However, with the increased interest in collecting and trading cards, we have observed a few challenges that have drawn our attention. Issues such as misplaced/lost items, allegations of theft, and disputes arising from what are perceived as unfair trades have caused some significant challenges for students and staff. At our school, our priority remains to provide a safe, respectful, and nurturing environment for our students.

In light of these developments, we are taking proactive steps to address these concerns while preserving the positive aspects of trading cards as a pastime. Our intention is not to curb the enthusiasm of our young collectors but to channel their passion in a way that ensures fairness, responsibility, and learning experiences.

We invite you to stay engaged with the school community as we finalise and implement this trading card policy and further your own discussions at home about the importance of fairness and respect. Your support and involvement are invaluable as we work together to create an enriching and responsible culture within our school.

#### **Draft: Student Responsibility for Trading Cards and Valuables Guidelines**

#### **Purpose:**

These guidelines aim to promote student responsibility and respectful behaviour concerning the possession and trading of trading cards and valuable items within the school premises. It emphasises self-accountability and good conduct among students while minimizing disruptions to the learning environment.

#### **Possession of Trading Cards and Valuables:**

Students are allowed to bring trading cards and valuable items, such as collectible cards, or personal valuables, to school. It is the responsibility of each student to ensure the safekeeping and security of their trading cards and valuables.

#### **Respect and Fairness:**

Students are expected to treat one another with respect and fairness when engaging in trading activities. Any form of coercion, bullying, or harassment related to trading cards or valuables is strictly prohibited.

#### **Security and Responsibility:**

Students are solely responsible for the safety and security of their trading cards and valuables.

When not in use, these items should be securely stored away in your bag.

#### **Dispute Resolution:**

In cases of disputes or conflicts related to trading or valuables, students should take the initiative to resolve the issue through constructive communication and compromise.

Teachers or school staff may provide guidance and support if necessary. However staff and the school will not be responsible for trades made.

#### **Educational Use:**

Teachers may integrate trading cards and valuables into the curriculum for educational purposes, provided it aligns with the learning objectives.

#### **Special Events and Designated Areas:**

The school may designate specific areas or times for trading activities or events.

Trading cards and valuables may be allowed during lunch breaks, after-school clubs, or other approved school activities.

#### **Consequences:**

Failure to comply fairly and respectfully when trading may be followed up through the schools behaviour and/or bullying policies, including but not limited to warnings, loss of trading privileges, and parent/guardian involvement. The school will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or theft of personal items.



#### **Royal Life Saving Swim Teacher Course**

There is a shortage of Swimming Instructors so if you are interested in becoming an Instructor then this is for you!

Royal Life are offering a Swim Teacher Course at Wudinna on Monday October 9 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

The Royal Life Saving Swim Teacher Course provides the minimum requirements for those persons wishing to become a Swim Instructor (for ages 4 and above).

Open to anyone16 years and over. There are no prerequisites for this course.

It is assumed that participants are sufficiently physically fit and healthy to undertake this course. The following physical activities will occur during the course unless you advise of any physical difficulties or limitations: kneeling, bending over, crouching, standing, leaning, sitting, pushing, lifting weights, swimming 100m and tread water for 1min, towing, diving, carrying and other physical

An optional CPR qualification to all Swim Teacher candidates is offered, which is conducted within the course (HLTAID009 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation). This is a requirement to obtain your RLSSA Swim Teacher License, and must be renewed every 12 months to keep you license current. Please

contact us if you already have a current CPR qualification and don't wish to complete this component.

A valid Working with Children Check (WWCC) is required to undertake your practical training hours at an aquatic facility, as well as for your Swim Teacher License application.
